Analyse the painting, first on your own, following the guideline... then you may check on the web to find out more about the artistic movement

1. Comment upon the title and the date. Deduce the artistic movement and the period.

The scene takes place on stairs . The names of the characters sound from the Middle-Ages. We may guess that it will be a story of lovers ; the stairs convey secrecy or a hidden meeting . 1864 belongs to the Victorian period . It comes after the romantic movement but there are romantic characteristics in the painting.

The emotions are implied in the details of the painting and the feelings are conveyed through the attitude of the characters, the setting and the atmosphere.

The couple is a pair of star-crossed lovers (lovers whose relationship is doomed to failure).
